I'm a....Spring Chicken!!!



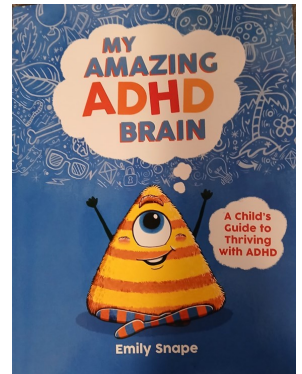
