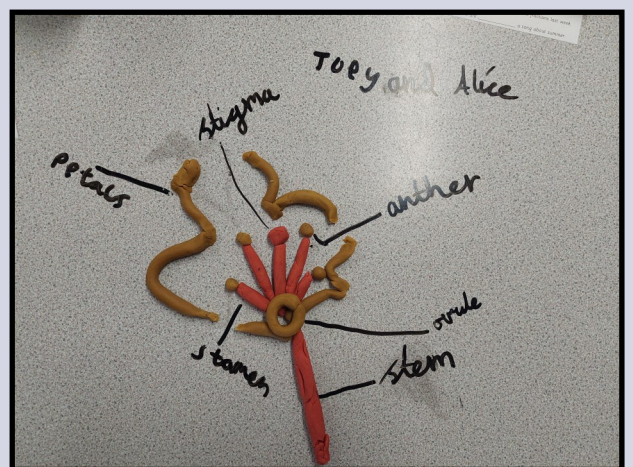
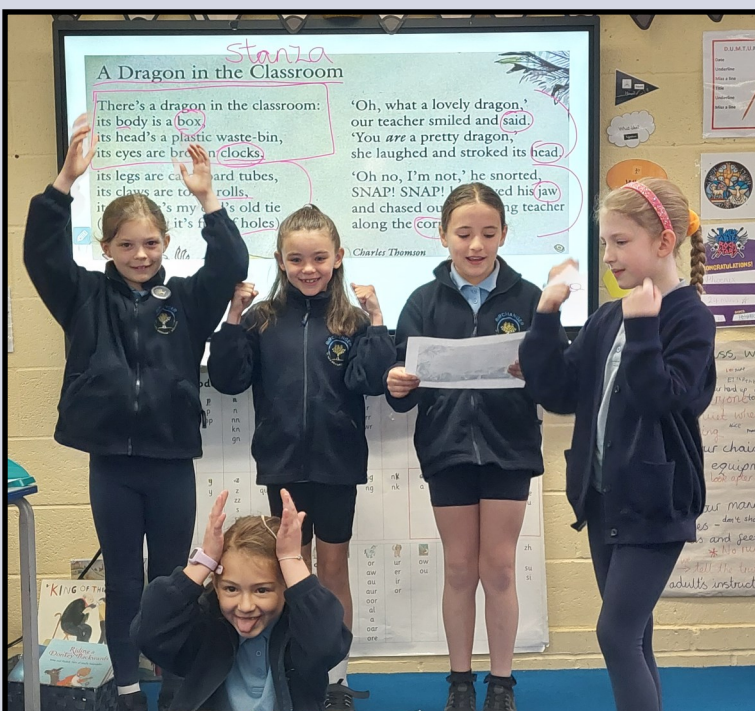
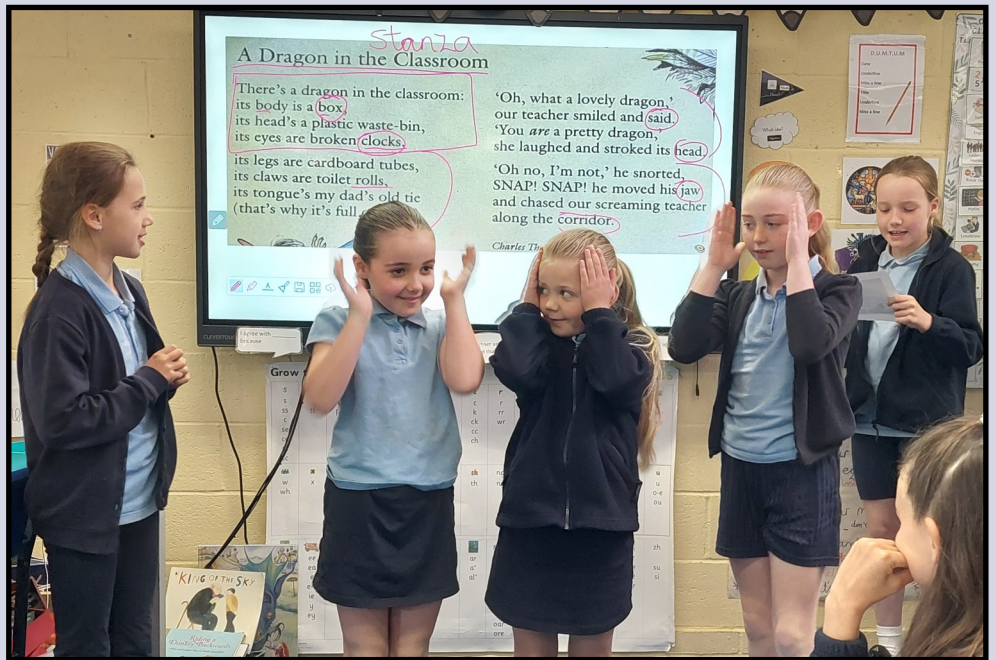
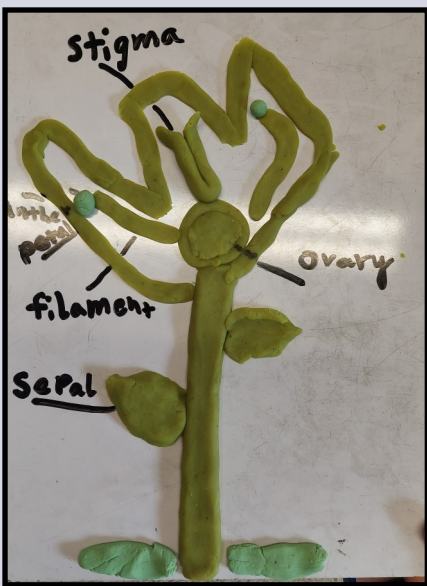


Kestrel Class have been well-fed this week, enjoying a mix of continental and cooked breakfasts courtesy of Mrs Burton and Mrs Cook!
